Student debt has hit an all time high in America at 1.6 trillion dollars*. However, attending an expensive university and paying over \$10k a semester is not necessary to receive an outstanding education that will set you on a track for success.

Generation Z (those born between 2000-2020) realize that a quality community college education can launch them directly into a career with less debt or provide all the preparation to transfer to a four-year college or university. FVCC's in-district tuition and fees are about 32% less than in-state tuition and fees at Montana's public universities.

For some students, this means graduating without any debt at all thanks to FVCC's generous scholarship offerings. Last year, FVCC students were awarded nearly \$1.2 million in need-based and merit-based scholarships.

Students at FVCC cite the professional world-class faculty, individualized attention they receive and the abundant student support services as key reasons to their success. Students can complete their education at FVCC and transfer to a four-year school or university or complete their career and technical training and go directly into the workforce using connections between the college and local employers to secure jobs.


