

## Commercial Driver's License (CDL) Licensure Disclosure

Upon completion of [HEO 103 Professional Truck Driver](#), students will learn the skills necessary to obtain a Class A CDL learner's permit through classroom instruction. This course also includes the driving experience necessary for students to pass the pre-trip, skills, and driving exam for the Montana Class A CDL. In addition, students will receive the necessary training in order to obtain a School Bus, Combo, Air Brakes, and Tanker endorsements.

With an unrestricted Class A license, the Montana CDL license holder (over the age of 21) is able to drive in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. If a CDL license holder moves to another state, the license holder will typically need to transfer the CDL to the new state.

This disclosure indicates, as of May 17, 2022, the states that FVCC has determined through a reasonable, good faith effort that HEO 103 meets or does not meet the educational requirements for licensure or certification, or for which states FVCC has yet to make a determination.

If you are planning to pursue professional licensure or certification in a state other than Montana, we recommend that you contact the appropriate licensing board in that state to seek information and guidance regarding licensure or certification requirements before beginning an academic program.
